

We're Working Toward Justice

April is multi-focused.

We start out by expanding our knowledge of the Muslim Community:

- The Islamic Center is holding an Open House on Saturday, April 2nd @ the Islamic Center in Orono from 5-7 P.M. Check the Center's website: www.ico.com. We're putting together a car pooling effort since the *Community Connector* is not an option.
- Worship Service on April 10th led by members of the Islamic Center. Ask Nancy Jacobson (942-4924).

Let's do something about **Food Security. It is a major component of our UU mission** and a clear way to help level the playing field. Spring is a perfect time to put this in the forefront:

- UU Youth will be in charge of gathering the food contributions that are brought to church and delivering them to the Ecumenical Food Cupboard and Bangor Homeless Shelter during March, April and May. Pam Healy, with assistance from our committee, will gather and deliver thru the summer.
- Charlie Boothby will be getting the Gleaning Project underway as soon as the Farmer's Market in Brewer has a surplus. Find out about the team he has in place for this.
- **Soup Kitchen** the 1st Monday of every month at the Salvation Army. Contact **Pat Moulton** (942-2292) or **Marj Lawrence** (862-3994) to see how you can help.
- **Free Bean Supper** on the 4th and 5th Saturday of every month. Casseroles and extra helping hands are always needed. Supper is often served to as many as 100 people. Now that we have met with all of our pre-candidates, the search committee will perform the difficult task of determining which of them best meets the needs of our congregation as outlined in the results of our survey and cottage meetings and your discussions with us. We can safely say at this point that each one of the candidates has many good qualities that would serve our congregation well. The committee's task will be to weigh these qualities in relation to our hierarchy of needs as delineated by the congregation before making a decision about which one we think would be the best fit.

The UUA Transitions Office specifies that all congregations in search must wait until the first Thursday of April at noon before contacting the minister of their choice. At that point, assuming our number one choice also has chosen us, we will make plans for them to come for a full week of candidating. We cannot announce the candidate until after they have accepted our offer and completed a favorable background check.

The candidate will visit UUSB for a week sometime in late April to mid-May (depending on their availability and our schedule). It will be important for everyone, young and old, to participate in candidating week. This will be your chance to meet and get to know the candidate. During the candidating week, the Transition Team, Search Committee, and Membership/Fellowship Committee will develop a schedule for the candidate to meet with as many committees and members of the congregation as possible. It will be an exciting week, full of meetings and activities. The candidate will conduct the service on both Sundays of that week, and after the second Sunday's service there will be a congregational meeting to vote on whether to call the candidate as our next settled minister. UUSB will put out a special call for all members and friends to attend these important services and participate in the week's activities.

We hope that the information we've provided here can help to ease some of the concerns. The Search Committee has collectively invested thousands of hours in the search process on your behalf. It has been an inspiring journey, and we look forward to soon being able to share the final results with you.




