



Drew's Views

Last week, I attended the Common Ground Country Fair in Unity. It was a marvelous experience! I was surprised at the sheer size of the fair dedicated to organic/sustainable agriculture and living. I was excited to see just a blend of vendors selling sustainable wares, amazing workshops and livestock demonstrations, and handicrafts from spinning to weaving to woodworking and blacksmithing. And of course, fabulous food (the egg rolls made by the UU church in Ellsworth were the best)! I was also excited to see fellow UUsers from across the state at the Maine UU Social Action Network (MUUSAN) table.

The fair was a cornucopia of sensory stimuli of tastes, sounds, smells, sights, and touch. As I walked through the fair, I felt a joyousness fill my heart for several hours. I felt I connected, excited and touched with the way people young and old interacted with each other – it was an amazing af-fair (pun intended)!

After several hours of wandering around, I sat down for a while to just take it all in. The sun had come out, and its rays provided a welcome warmth that contrasted to the soggiess of my clothes from the earlier rain and the cool autumn wind that brought the reminder that winter was coming ...

One of the techniques that I have been cultivating in my meditation practice is sitting with moments like these when they happen. Feeling the sun, memorizing the smells, enjoying the tastes and energy of excitement and joy that comes from being in a special place just at the right time. I find doing this useful not only because it brings joy to my heart, but also because it provides a storehouse of memories that I can tap into later on when times are harder going.

This reminds me of one of my favorite stories I heard as a child – the story of Frederick by Leo Lionni. It's a story of a little field mouse who all through the summer and fall sat and soaked up the experience of these special moments, while his fellow mouse friends worked hard and laid in supplies for the cold winter months ahead.

Periodically they would check in with Frederick and ask him what he was doing because they thought he was being lazy, and Frederick would reply: "I am gathering colors, or words, or rays for the sun to keep us warm in the winter days ahead when we run out of nuts and straw and things to eat." And of course, his projections came true – for when the mouse family ran out of food, Frederick kept the family warm and happy through the rest of the winter with his warm thoughts and imagery.

As the days grow shorter and the temperatures cooler, I encourage you all to look for those moments of joy and natural beauty that life presents you with—especially in the fall which is filled with such amazing natural beauty and contrast.

May you take the time to sit and enjoy those moments, and memorize with warmth, the colors, the smells, the tastes, and sounds. May you enjoy those moments as they happen, and may you also hold those moments so they can sustain you in the days ahead.





In the case of bad weather, the most important thing is for everyone to be safe. Please do not travel to the UUSB for morning worship if you feel that doing so would be unsafe. UUSB may need to be cancelled due to no lights, no heat, no water, disasters, and other unforeseen circumstances.

The decision to cancel worship and religious education will be made by Sue McKay, the Rev. Moeller and Laurie Cartier, who will reach such decision by 7:00 A.M. Sunday morning. An announcement will be put on the outgoing phone message of the church office at 207-947-7009, and announcements will also go out to the local network television and radio stations; and, if possible (power permitting), an announcement will be sent out via email, on the UUSB Facebook page, and posted on the UUSB website: uubangor.org.
