THIS MONTH IN WORSHIP

Our theme this month is "Deep Listening."

October 4 - A Different Kind of Listening - Listening is a primary element in communication. It helps us learn, interact, and engage with others. But, is there another way to "hear" what is happening in the world? This week, we will explore another way of listening that takes communication to another level. This service will be led by Rev. Drew, with Phyllis Havens as our worship associate, Laurie Cartier and Janel Worcester-Brown as our technical coordinators, and music provided by Molly J. Webster.

October 11 - Indigenous People's Day - This week Dwayne Tomah will join us. He is the youngest fluent Passamaquoddy speaker, who is translating and interpreting songs and stories from wax cylinders recorded nearly 130 years ago. He will bring us songs and language from his culture to teach us about their history and the lessons their songs have to teach us, if we take time to listen. This service will be led by Dwayne Tomah, with Laurie Cartier as our worship associate, Kim McKeage as our technical coordinator, and music provided by Rissa Moore.

October 18 - What Was That? - Being able to hear and listen has a huge effect on the quality of our lives. This Sunday, Rev. Drew explores the power of listening and hearing from a physical, mental, and spiritual perspective. This service will be led by Rev. Drew Moeller, with Phyllis Havens as our worship associate, John Arimond as our technical coordinator, and music by Molly J. Webster.

October 25 - *UUism* - This service will be led by Caleigh Grogan, with Laurie Cartier as our worship associate, Kim McKeage as our technical coordinator, and music by Molly J. Webster.

Dear Ones.

Fall seems to have come early this year - the cooler weather, the leafs changing color, and the days getting shorter. Often during this time of year, we'd be settling into old familiar habits of school, work, and preparing for holidays and harvest rituals. However, this year is very different between ever-changing plans, COVID disruptions, an incredibly intense election season, and natural disasters happening out West and down South. It's a struggle to find a place of comfort, certainty, or even room to breathe.

The good news is that while many things are pulling on our hearts, there is also a lot to celebrate in our congregation's life. Here are some highlights:

- Last month, our Council participated in an online leadership retreat. At the retreat, we identified some of our goals for the year. We began exploring how we might start a conversation about reviewing our past strategic plans and start a visioning process that will lead to an updated vision/action plan for our future.
- · Last month, Karen Childs, our director of Spiritual Exploration - SE (formerly known as RE), began a completely re-imagined, hybrid SE for our young people.
- Our UUSB delegates participated in the historic Northern New England District (NNED) meeting. One-hundred-fifty-three delegates, from fifty-two congregations, voted to dissolve the NNED and give the district's remaining assets to the UUA to be used in a "substantially similar manner to their current usage." Thanks to Jean Adamson, Tracy Haskell, and Laura Noble, who served as our UUSB delegates to this historic event.
- This month I will begin offering two adult SE programs;
 - An Introduction to Mindfulness Meditation, which will last five sessions

 Soul Searchers Group - an ongoing group that will focus on looking inwards to become aware of our inner-relationship with race, and privilege, as we look to find ways to eliminate its effects and work towards healing ourselves and society

I am also very excited to introduce Sojourner Hodges Crowley, our new Collaborative Accompanist. Sojourner starts on October 4. I encourage you to take a moment to read over Sojourner's bio in this issue of the Chalice & Chimes on page six and welcome her to our **UUSB Music Ministry Program!**

As many of you know, this past August, we lost one of our oldest and dearest members, Teddy Weston. In August, I officiated a small graveside service for Teddy's family and close friends. I have been working with Teddy's family and we have set up a special UUSB Memorial Service for Teddy on October 17 at 11 AM. We hope you can attend this online service of mourning and celebration. We are also thankful to Teddy and her family, who have donated \$20K to UUSB in Teddy's memory. Our Council and Trustees are working to figure out the best way to utilize these funds in a way that we believe would make Teddy proud.

Fall is a time of many transitions. Even more so this year. As the season continues to share its unfolding wisdom, let us be reminded to keep turning and returning to the core of what matters in our lives.

May we remind ourselves that despite all the tumult and disruption, UU values and community continue to provide nourishment, peace, and hope for the future.





TREASURER'S REPORT

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR MONTH OF August written in Sept.

August covers 16.7% of the year.

Income for the month of August was \$10,845. Expenses were \$15,541 leaving a net balance of (\$4,696) for the month. The net income for the 2 months ending 8/31/20 is \$9,172.

Income in August included pledges of \$6,436. Because 13 people prepaid their pledges for a total of \$16,198, total pledges received through 8/31/20 is \$36,928, representing 31.5% of the budget.

VANCO payments came from 16 people totaling \$1,359 gross in all categories with a net of \$1,349.

The August checking account balance was \$31,997- up from July's \$ 31,390. Our financial situation is looking very good.

Plate contributions for August were \$456, half of which was sent to Food AND Medicine.

Expenses for the month break down as \$12,625 for Personnel, \$1,331 for Building, \$837 Fair Share to the UUA, and all other \$748 for the total of \$15,541.

Open Air Chimes Concert & Food Collection



On Sunday, October 11th, UUSB will once again host our Second Sunday Food Drive and Open Air Concert, the church's monthly community food collection, from 12:00 noon - 1:00 p.m. There will be drop off bins on the Park Street sidewalk in front of the church for those wishing to donate.

In addition, from 12:00 – 12:30 p.m., the church will offer a 30-minute bell/chimes concert from the church's historic bell tower. One of only 6 genuine tower bell instruments in Maine, and the only manually-played chime in Bangor (installed 1919), the 10-bell, Meneely "C Chime" instrument will be played by Rissa Moore.

We invite all within the Bangor community to step outside and take a listen. You are welcome to enjoy from the church lawn and surrounding areas, but please be absolutely certain to observe social distancing practices of at least 6 feet, or listen from the comfort of your enclosed car. People driving by or listening outside should wear cloth masks for the safety of all.

The food donations will be contributed to the Ecumenical Food Pantry in Bangor. So far this year, this curbside food drive has collected over 1,684 pounds of food. We hope that we can exceed the earlier record of over 400 pounds collected this past May!

In these trying and uncertain times, with many people affected by the COVID virus and its many social/economic impacts, it is certainly a gift to be able to experience a sense of unity and celebration through music.



Soul Searchers: Reflections on Racism, Privilege, & Healing A New Year-Long Spiritual Exploration Series

The issue of conditioned racism has led to many evils in our society and has affected our societal and spiritual well being. Talking about these issues can be hard. Talking about these issues is necessary if we are to grow and recognize our conditioning and develop a strategy to remove/decolonize some of those internal biases.

This Soul Searchers group, led by Rev. Drew

and others, is a year-long program mixing a

large group, small groups, and sincere individual reflections that seeks to provide the sacred space of the beloved community. We will focus on uncovering our own experiences and struggles with racial bias in a mindful and non-judgmental way to help us become more Woke and more sensitive to the power of racial bias in our hearts and minds. Our goal is to help each other develop skills to examine our assumptions and biases around racial issues, work towards becoming skilled practitioners

of anti-racism and anti-oppression, and

become healers of racial harm.

Owing to the nature of this work, we ask that participants make a year-long commitment, October through May, which will include:

- a monthly large group meeting, usually a Sunday afternoon, for 1.5 hours
- a monthly small group meeting of 5-6 people, day & time decided by the small group, for 1.5 hours
- weekly journaling with prompts on one's own relationship with issues of race and privilege

Democracy Task Force

The Poor People's Campaign has launched a mass organizing project to get out the vote called MORE: Mobilize, Organize, Register, Educate. One part of the project includes phone-banking. Go to PPC.org to learn how to get involved. Another PPC goal called the 1000:1000 Prophetic Pledge is to get 1000 faith and community organizations to each pledge to turn out 1000 voters. They are asking for our endorsement. Whether formalized or not, there are many ways to get out the vote including our Social Justice Committee's proposal to have each congregation member talk with five persons you know and encourage each of them to talk to five other people. You can

engage them in "relational" conversations about whether or not they plan to vote and if they have any questions like where to obtain and/or how to deliver an absentee ballot. These relational efforts support the national UU campaign to "UU the Vote" in line with our UU principles. Other ways to get involved include the campaigns of Food and Medicine, Maine Equal

Justice, and the Maine League of Women Voters to get out the vote.
