### **DREW'S VIEWS**

#### BY REV. ANDREW MOELLER

Dear Ones.

In my conversations over the last month or so, I've heard many people who are very happy to see the year 2020 end. After all, it has been a year that has been very taxing on our being from all the ripple effects of a worldwide pandemic to the flaring-up of political, racial, and social unrest. Much has happened, many lives have been lost, and there seems to be a growing over-abundance of suffering worldwide.

Reflecting on this past year, I, too, feel a bit of heaviness in my soul. I also remain somewhat in awe of the amount of imagination, creativity, and dedicated effort that has happened in our community as we have gone about re-imagining our world. Even with restrictions on physical gathering, mask-wearing, and extra handwashing, we, as a congregation, have found creative ways to continue to support and nurture and grow our faith while staying true to our principles.

Think about it! A year ago, if we said we were going to host all our worship services and committee meetings electronically, I would have said, "I doubt it." Here are some of our milestones:

- in less than a year, we have transitioned to holding engaging online Zoom worship services,
- we've enhanced and transformed our Spiritual Exploration programs for our young people and adults
- we have held several successful online FUNdraisers
- we gathered over 2,880 pounds of food for the local food bank and provided community chimes concerts for Bangor monthly
- many of our social justice committee members have worked locally to get out the vote and partnered with UUA efforts to "UU the Vote."

 we have also welcomed new members to our congregation who know us primarily by our online activities - having never set foot in our building before joining.

It's hard to imagine that these things would never have happened the way they have without the COVID-19 pandemic. While I am grateful for all the ways we have grown as a community and supported each other this past year, it's important to remember that they have come with a cost. 1.8 million people around the world have lost their lives to this pandemic. We have willingly given up some of our freedoms to make the world safer. For some giving up these freedoms feels like an act of loving-kindness, while for others, COVID restrictions feel like an unbearable burden. For most of us, I would guess our response is a mix.

"Necessity is the mother of invention," says the wisdom attributed to Plato in *The Republic*. One of the things that I continue to be grateful for as we head into the new year is our faith and faith community that embraces and is willing to adapt to change; be it in relation to a new pandemic, a new awareness of white privilege and exclusive behavior, or theological understanding of ourselves and our place in the cosmos

Even as we are weary spiritually, mentally, and physically as we head into the new year, may we find ways to continue to nurture ourselves and embrace the hope of a COVID-less world, even as we mourn the many losses.

May we also continue to remain open to the imaginative qualities of a free faith that is adaptable and transformative, even in the face of challenge and loss.

"A pile of rocks..." says Antoine de Saint-Exupery, "ceases to be a rock pile when somebody contemplates it with the idea of a cathedral in mind."

The Council had Mike Grondin as our guest this month to give us some updates from Budget & Finance. There are some financial concerns; there are some pledges that haven't been paid at all and some that aren't coming in as regularly as they have in the past. There have been some expensive repairs to the building, and some repairs that are still needed which is putting Buildings and Grounds over budget. They are looking into the use of Capital Funds and some of the PPP money to help out.

We discussed the latest updates on COVID and where we stand currently. There is some hope with the new, very effective vaccines starting to be administered. We know it will still be awhile before we are all able to be back in the Sanctuary together, but we are all very hopeful that will happen in 2021, although, likely not until late summer or fall.

### **Huge Success with the Gift Basket FUNdraiser!**

On December 12th, the UUSB Basket sales took on a new and incredible life of its own. Normally the baskets are put together by a group at church and are placed out for two or three weekends for folks to do silent bidding on. Most of us have seen it, we walk around, check out a basket and put our name and bid down on the bottom of a list of ever growing bids.

But this year, with the ongoing pandemic and the inability to meet together and have service together, something new happened. The organizers of the Basket sales decided to hold an online auction via Zoom. Zooming away just like we do for our Sunday service.

Will people show up? The mantra of any event organizer, but the group did an awesome job with all of the preliminary footwork. There was a great and colorful 17 page online document to see what each basket looked like as well as a list of all the things that were being offered.

It was also set up as a Facebook event and garnered lots of interest there. The organizers made sure the pictures and the writeups were enticing and accurate and it showed in the quality of the whole process.

But will people show up? And the answer was... yes they did. I counted 50 Zoom connections in the list on Saturday and many of those had more than one person attending!

And did they bid? Yes, they did! With 33 baskets (and one extra surprise basket at the end), the committee brought in \$3,000, which I would hazard to guess is more than any other Basket sale/auction the church has held before (last year we made about \$1,800).

Bidding went super smooth with Sue McKay as the auctioneer and folks either entering their bids in the Zoom chat window or those on the phone calling them out. Sometimes the bids would come in so fast, poor Sue was having a hard time keeping ahead of them. And with 33 baskets to auction, you might have thought it would take a long time, but no, the whole auction only took 90 minutes!

Again, an amazing job between all the footwork to recruit for the baskets; get everything put together into great presentable baskets; make the PDF document to send out to everyone; get it on FaceBook; make the slideshow for the online auction display; and then run it smoothly and cleanly in just 90 minutes!

This is what it looks like when members of our community band together, even when apart, and not only did folks come away with some wonderful baskets to either keep or give away as presents, but for those who didn't, it was still fun to watch and maybe throw in a bid even if you didn't win it.

Thank you to Suzanne Kelly, Sue McKay, Cathy Elliot, Cindy Todd, Judy and Tim Martin, Kate Dutra and Kerrie O'Brien for making this happen for our community. We just wanted to know we appreciate all you did. And thank you to all the people who donated items for the baskets.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR MONTH OF **November** written in December. This report covers 42% of the year.

Total income for the month of November was \$13,845. Expenses were \$17,483 leaving a net balance of (\$3,638) for the month. The net income for the 5 months ending 11/30/20 is \$5,622.

November income included pledge of \$8,951. Total pledges received through 11/30/20 is \$62,553 representing 53.5% of the budget. To keep on track, monthly pledges need to average \$7,778. We had a great month for plate donations: \$442. Half of that amount was sent to the Penquis Fuel Assistance Program. Total Income for 5 months was 39.8% of the budget.

VANCO payments came from 17 people totaling \$2,140.60 gross in all categories with a net of \$2,081.35. Fees were \$59.25 and the offset paid in was \$46.60. VANCO is very convenient, but mailing a check is cheaper (says a penny pincher).

The November checking account balance was \$17,389, down \$3,164 from October's \$20,553.

Expenses for the month break down as \$12,264 for Personnel, \$2,856 for Building, \$837 Fair Share to the UUA, \$100 Administrative and \$1,426 for Congregational expenses. Total expenses for 5 months were 34.7% of the budget.

Our financial situation is good at this time. However, we do not know the outcome of our two largest fundraisers: the Raffle which was budgeted for an income of \$18,000 and the Spring Auction budgeted for \$6,500.

In December, I completed the application to convert our Payroll Protection Program Loan into a grant. Review will take 3-4 weeks, and then we will have the \$23,500 to spend for expenses.



The Financial Stewardship Committee has started working on the upcoming Pledge Campaign for fiscal year 2021-2022 and we're very excited to share with you that our theme will be:

UUSB Zooming Forward... Paving the Road Ahead!

It's more important than ever to give thought to envisioning our path forward in this changed world, and how important our pledge of financial support will be to making those visions become a reality.

Pledge Sunday will be March 7th, so mark your calendars and stay tuned for more details on this exciting event!

# Ringing Bells and Feeding Souls

January 10 at 12:00 PM

Open Air Chimes Concert & Food Collection



On Sunday, January 10th, UUSB will once again host our Second Sunday Food Drive and Open Air Concert, the church's monthly community food collection, from 12:00 noon – 12:30 p.m. There will be drop off bins on the Park Street sidewalk in front of the church for those wishing to donate. Winter is coming, but UUSB's second Sunday food collection and chimes concert will go on. Worried about icy sidewalks? Don't be. Just drive by 120 Park Street, and wait in the comfort of your vehicle while someone takes your donation and places it in the bins. Crack a window and enjoy the chimes.

In addition, from 12:00 – 12:30 p.m., the church will offer a 30-minute bell/chimes concert from the church's historic bell tower. One of only 6 genuine tower bell instruments in Maine, and the only manually-played chime in Bangor (installed 1919), the 10-bell, Meneely "C Chime" instrument will be played.

We invite all within the Bangor community to step outside and take a listen. You are welcome to enjoy from the church lawn and surrounding areas, but please be absolutely certain to observe social distancing practices of at least 6 feet, or listen from the comfort of your enclosed car. People driving by or listening outside should wear cloth masks for the safety of all.

The food donations will be contributed to the Ecumenical Food Pantry in Bangor. So far this year, this curbside food drive has collected over 2,000 pounds of food.

As winter is here and the weather is ever changing, we wanted to let you know that we can change things if the weather is bad for the Ringing of Bells and Feeding of Souls. If conditions make it difficult for you to get out of your car to drop of food items, you can drive down to the parking spot at the base of the church and Tim and Judy will have the bins in their vehicle and will take them from yours. Stay safe out there but please continue to bring in these much needed items and stick around and listen to the beautiful bells being played! Happy winter, and be safe out there.



# SHARE THE PLATE

In January, half of the undesignated funds in the plate will go to Faith Linking in Action, one of the programs associated with Food AND Medicine. FLIA works with local faith groups to help address the reasons people fall into and get stuck in poverty. UUSB has worked with FLIA and Food AND Medicine for many years to help improve the Bangor area's access to food, housing, and more.

In November, we were able to share \$221 with Penquis CAP's LiHEAP program. And, in December, we shared our plate with the UUSB Food Security Programs.


