Changes to COVID Policy

The Council voted to start having families/individuals make their own decisions regarding COVID precautions (such as masking and social distancing) as well as allowing program directors to make the decisions they feel are best for their participants. TREASURER'S REPORT

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR MONTH OF OCTOBER 2022. This report covers 33% of the year.

Total income for the month of October was \$19,170. In Oct 2021 the income was \$12,489. This YTD income is \$74,858, 31% of the year's budget. Last year's YTD income was \$87,480, 38% of the year's budget. Expenses were \$17,554. giving us a plus \$1,616 for the month. YTD expenses are \$73,101 30% of the budget. In October 2021, expenses were \$16,496 and last year's YTD expenses were \$69,663, 29% of the budget.

October income included pledge of \$12,188. Plate donations were \$639. Half of that amount goes to Partners for Peace, which works to end domestic violence. Endowments were \$3,622, final Yard Sale income \$1,894, which is \$394 over the budgeted amount. Many thanks to those involved, especially Kate Dutra and her mother Betsy Reed. Rent was \$470. General Fund was \$69.


VANCO: In October 2022: 14 people used the Vanco link to make payments totaling \$1,862 gross in all categories with a net of \$1,818. Fees were \$19.82 and the offset paid was \$23.48. Additional charges invoiced were \$24.69. Donations were General Fund for \$29, pledges for \$1,676, and Share the Plate for \$134. In October 2021 Vanco was used by 12 people for \$1,372 gross income.

Expenses for the month break down as Personnel \$13,027 (74% of total costs), Building \$628 (4%). We received a dividend check for our building insurance from Church Mutual of \$1,225. Fair Share to the UUA \$845 (5%), Administrative \$662 (4%) and Congregational expenses for \$2,380 (14%) Total expenses for 4 months was 30% of the year's budget.

Fundraising is happening! The Yard Sale was a great success, exceeding the budget amount. Many thanks to Sue McKay, Kate Dutra, and her mom Betsy Reed. Cathy Elliott has started soliciting Gift Baskets. You can donate your own basket or items to go into a basket. The order has been placed for wreaths from Piper Mountain. The opportunity to reserve your wreaths and swags will be open in late November.

So much to look forward to in activities which support UUSB!





The food collected is given to the Ecumenical Food Pantry in Bangor. They can also take monetary donations, which buys up to six pounds of food for every dollar given. Make checks out to Bangor Ecumenical Food Cupboard (Bangor EFC), and we'll keep feeding souls.

In 2022, we have collected 2,067.5 pounds so far! You are making a difference!

Throughout the pandemic, our volunteers have continued to put on the monthly community bean suppers as to-go meals. This has made it possible for at-risk volunteers and community members to pick up their food and avoid as much potential exposure as possible. We are thankful to all the amazing volunteers who have done all this work, despite the stress and changes over the last two years!

As guidelines and risks have changed, the Community Bean Supper has also made adjustments. With our recent changes, meals may be eaten at UUSB in the Dorothy Memorial Hall or taken home in to-go containers. This allows us to bring back the community and social aspects of this monthly event, while still accommodating those who may be at higher risk or unable to attend in person.

If you have any large paper grocery bags, like from Hannaford2Go, the Bean Supper crew are looking for additional bags to use to send meals home with those who attend each month.



- 3. Donate online through Vanco. This option will be available on our website, as well as shared in our weekly e-news




