DREW'S VIEWS

Dear Ones,

On March 19 in the Northern Hemisphere, we celebrate the vernal equinox and the return of Spring. In response to this milestone of the earth's journey around the sun, many religious traditions have celebrations relating to change, including ancient fertility rituals, Easter. This Passover, and year, Ramadan also falls around the vernal equinox. From a religious perspective, Spring is a holiday that is busier than winter solstice and the beginning of the new year.

Spring is one of the most noticeable seasonal changes. The transition from cold weather and flat light from the low-riding sun - to a brighter light, longer days, and intense colors emerging from dull browns and greys brings excitement to our hearts and minds.

Spring celebrates change and transformation - the earth warms and signals to seeds and plants that it's time to wake up and start growing again. It's a signal to start the sap flowing again to the deciduous trees, and for animals it's time to wake up from hibernation. This embracing of change and rebirth contrasts the human tendency to desire sameness, routine, and predictability.

Yet there is something about the intensity and beauty of Spring - even early in the process of Spring that allows

us to overcome our resistance to transformation if even for a moment to witness the tender shoots bursting forth, the bright colors, and the returning of warmth that allows us to let our guard down and let the change in.

This is a beautiful reminder of some things coming alive in our congregation as we head into spring! In particular there two things need your participation and response:

As I write this Council Cryer, March has yet to arrivewill we be greeted by a lion or a lamb?

Council listened to a cooperative proposal from Food & Medicine, Needlepoint Sanctuary and UUSB to establish a raised bed collective garden. Tamra from Food & Medicine described their ever growing collective food

gardens program and is looking forward to seeding such a venture at UUSB. Volunteers will be needed to ensure that the garden grows food to reduce food insecurity in our area. Council enthusiastically approved this proposal!

Willie Hurley from Needle Point Sanctuary attended our meeting to discuss the proposed rental agreement. He identified his needs and how they will be utilizing their rental space. Council approved this rental as long our certificate of occupancy is granted. By the time you read this NPS could be our new neighbor!

Rev. Drew shared in his Minister's report a need to explore the necessary steps needed to repair the windows that were damaged during storms.

Christine has volunteered to be the initial point of contact for security alarm issues. The backup people will remain the same. Thank you Christine!

Tim Martin continues his diligent work on editing the UUSB Board book - it has been quite the slog, a tip 'o the nib and many thanks Tim!

Zach Falcon provided Council an update on Security and Safety Protocols. In many areas UUSB is doing well. There are some areas needing attention and the working group has identified a punch list. He felt that this work is important and urged Council to keep the momentum going with this work. Council plans to continue this discussion at our March meeting.

Council welcomed gifts from the Appleton and Mekrut estates to our capital fund.

Lastly, once again, a message of gratitude and thanks for our Beloved UUSB Community. Council is grateful for everyone for pitching in, in whatever way you have done; from participating in Fellowship Hour, helping with a clean up day, working on a fundraiser, participating in a committee, greeting a visitor, smiling as you pass in the hallway or for simply showing up and being with us. TREASURER'S REPORT JAN. 2024

This report covers 58% of the year.

Total income for the month of January was \$25,707. YTD income is \$159,527, 61% of the year's budget In January 2023 income was \$17,813. Last year's YTD income was \$138,429, which did not include an income from the raffle. Total income in 2023 was 56% of the year's budget.

Expenses were \$25,163. YTD expenses of \$151,477 are 58% of the budget. In January 2023 expenses were \$19,683 and the year's YTD expenses were \$141,706, 57.7% of the budget.

January income included pledge of \$12,041. Plate donations were \$875. Half of that amount goes to the Bangor Public Library, which has one of the largest circulations in New England.. .Raffle income was \$6,540 Endowments were \$4,246. Rental income was \$885.


VANCO: In January 2024: 13 people used the Vanco link to make payments totaling \$1,477.98 gross in all categories with a net of \$1,423.11. Fees were \$17.31 and the offset paid was \$21.98. Additional charges invoiced were \$37.56. Donations were: General Fund for \$45, pledges for \$1,091, Raffle \$200 and Share the Plate for \$120.

Expenses for the month break down as Personnel \$14,591 (58% of total costs), Building \$2,941 (12%), Fair Share to the UUA \$869 (3%), Administrative \$584 (2%), and Congregational expenses for \$6,178 (\$5,000 is the cost of the Raffle prizes, so regular expenses are \$1,178) (25%).

The Raffle did not reach its expected goal, so we are looking for other ideas for Fundraising for the Spring. Next year we will not be having a raffle.





JUSTICE NOW NEWS

We have been redefining our goals and work model: more focused on specific justice actions that support our UU principles. On our plate right now is working towards getting gun safety legislation passed. To that end we have an event planned for Sunday, March 10th, 11:30AM-1:00PM. Lynn Ellis, co-chair of MUUSAN's (Maine Unitarian-Universalist State Advocacy Network) gun safety issue group and member of the Maine Gun Safety Coalition, will go over the gun safety bills (wording not finalized at the time I am writing this) the legislature will be voting on and what we can do to help get this crucial legislation passed:

- Assault weapons ban
- Extreme Risk Protection Order (Red flag law)
- 72 hour waiting period to buy a gun
- Background checks on all gun sales

Make a plan to be at church for this Justice Now event. Invite your friends, your state representative and senator, anyone who cares about this issue. This is something we can all work on. Childcare will be available.



Find out more about this action and other Justice Now news on our table in the Dorothy Memorial. Inspired by UUSB S.U.R.E (Showing Up for Racial Equity), we know that showing up is the most important thing we can do.

Second Sunday Food Collection

On **Sunday, March 10**, UUSB will once again host our Second Sunday Food Drive, the church's monthly community food collection. This month, we will continue collecting food during the service, instead of after the service.

In 2023, we donated 1,847 pounds of food!

The food collected is given to the Ecumenical Food Pantry in Bangor. They can also take monetary donations, which buys up to six pounds of food for every dollar given. Make checks out to Bangor Ecumenical Food Cupboard (Bangor EFC).

If you aren't sure what to give, they are always looking for cereal, canned fruit, canned baked beans, pasta, and sauce!
